

### Introduction for the Day

Today's gospel begins with two disciples walking to Emmaus, overcome with sadness, loss, and disappointment. They had hoped Jesus, who was crucified, would be the one to redeem Israel! Yet the risen Christ walks with them and then opens their eyes in the breaking of the bread. Each Sunday our hearts burn within us as the scriptures are proclaimed and Christ appears to us as bread is broken and wine is poured. The story of Emmaus becomes the pattern of our worship each Lord's day.

P Loving God, come and speak to our hearts today. May we, like those on the Emmaus Road, find your words burning with hope in our lives. Strengthen us and give us courage for the journey ahead. For we pray in Christ's Name. Amen.

# CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

- P Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, who calls us beloved children, who gathers us into one flock, who guides us into all truth.
- C Amen.
- P Let us confess our sins, trusting that God will forgive us and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Silence is kept for reflection.

P Faithful and just God,

- C we confess the ways that we are captive to doubt and fear, bound by the ways that lead to death.

  We have not loved our sisters and brothers as you have first loved us. Forgive us, God of mercy.

  Let your Holy Spirit work in us to change our lives and make us new, that we may know the abundant life given in Jesus Christ, our risen Lord. Amen.
- P In this is love, not that we loved God but that God loved us and sent the Son to atone for our sins. In the name of + Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. Let the perfect love of God cast out fear, fill you with joy, and inspire you to live for others.

# LESSON: Acts 2:14a, 36-41

Today's reading is the conclusion of Peter's sermon preached following the giving of the Holy Spirit to the apostles on the day of Pentecost. The center of his preaching is the bold declaration that God has made the crucified Jesus both Lord and Christ.

# PSALM 116:1-4, 12-19

- L <sup>1</sup>I love the LORD, who has heard my voice, and listened to my supplication,
- C <sup>2</sup>for the LORD has given ear to me whenever I called.
- L <sup>3</sup>The cords of death entangled me; the anguish of the grave came upon me; I came to grief and sorrow.
- C <sup>4</sup>Then I called upon the name of the LORD: "O LORD, I pray you, save my life."
- L 12How shall I repay the LORD for all the good things God has done for me?
- C 13I will lift the cup of salvation and call on the name of the LORD.

- L 14I will fulfill my vows to the LORD in the presence of all God's people.
- C <sup>15</sup>Precious in your sight, O LORD, is the death of your servants.
- L <sup>16</sup>O LORD, truly I am your servant; I am your servant, the child of your handmaid; you have freed me from my bonds.
- C 17I will offer you the sacrifice of thanksgiving and call upon the name of the LORD.
- L 18I will fulfill my vows to the LORD in the presence of all God's people,
- C <sup>19</sup>in the courts of the LORD's house, in the midst of you, O Jerusalem. Hallelujah!

# **LESSON: 1 Peter 1:17-23**

The imagery of exile is used to help the readers of this letter understand that they are strangers in a strange land. Christians no longer belong to this age. Through the death of Christ we belong to God, so that our focus, faith, and hope are no longer on such things as silver or gold.

APOSTLES' CREED page 105

C I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
