


LESSON: Isaiah 55:10-13

God's word to Israel's exiles is as sure and effective as never-failing precipitation. Their return to the Holy Land in a new exodus is cheered on by singing mountains and by trees that clap their hands.

- L ¹You are to be praised, O God, in Zion; to you shall vows be fulfilled.
- C ²To you, the one who answers prayer, to you all flesh shall come.

- L ³Our sins are stronger than we are, but you blot out our transgressions.
- C ⁴Happy are they whom you choose and draw to your courts to dwell there! They will be satisfied by the beauty of your house, by the holiness of your temple.
