

## **Greetings from Pastor Kristine Isder**

After a very mild winter, we made the transition into spring. We are now in the growing season. Leaves have opened up on trees. Animals have been born. Crops are in the process of being planted and growing.

Every year when the corn is planted, we wait anxiously to spot the first little green spears in the fields. Especially when it's been cold and wet, we wonder if the corn will ever come up. But it does. And then soon it's a couple inches tall and before long it's knee high and then waist high. All of this in a span of two months, a pretty high rate of growth.

In the church year we have celebrated the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday and the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday. We now move

into the Time after Pentecost.

The name for this season is "Ordinary Time". It doesn't mean "common" or "mundane", but comes from the word "ordinal" which simply means *counted time* (the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday after Pentecost, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday, etc.)

Counted time after Pentecost begins with Trinity Sunday and ends with Christ the King Sunday (the last Sunday before the beginning of Advent).

Green is the sanctuary color for Ordinary Time. Green has traditionally been associated with new life and growth. Even in Hebrew in the Old Testament, the same word for the color "green" also means "young". In Christian tradition, green came to symbolize the life of the church following Pentecost, as well as symbolizing

the hope of new life in the resurrection.

This long "green season" features a series of stories about Jesus' life. Green is for growing. While the crops are growing in the fields, we will also learn to grow in our faith through the teachings of Jesus.

Among the stories we will hear: The parable of the mustard seed, Jesus stills a storm, a girl restored to life and a woman healed, the mission of the twelve disciples, feeding of the five thousand, Jesus walks on water, curing a deaf man, Jesus blesses the children, the rich man, the healing of blind Bartimaeus, the first commandment, Jesus raises Lazarus to life, the widow's offering, Jesus tells Pilate about His kingdom.





## "Don't be Root-Bound"



As a new gardener, Jan Riggenbach used to treat bedding plants with extreme care, setting them into soil without disturbing the roots. Eventually she learned that rough — even ruthless — treatment is better in the long run.

"If the plant has been growing in its pot so long that the roots are circling the bottom, I jab my finger into the bottom of the soil and pull down to untangle the roots," Riggenbach wrote in her gardening column. "If the whole pot is filled with circling roots, I have to be merciless. I don't

worry if I break some of the roots. That's better than allowing the roots to continue to circle when the plants are growing in the garden."

In the same way, it's easy to grow complacent and inward-focused in our walk with God. But bunched-up roots can't reach out for sustenance. So for maximum faith growth, dare to let God shake you up from time to time!

## **Southwest Minnesota Synod**

### **Synod News**

#### 2024 Synod Assembly

The 2024 Synod Assembly will be held June 7 and 8 both in person and online.

Voting members from the synod's congregations and all rostered minsters in the Southwestern Minnesota Synod will gather to worship, learn, conduct business, and prayerfully deliberate about what God is calling us to do in the synod. The Synod Assembly is the highest legislative authority within the SW MN Synod.

Four zoom hearings were held prior to the assembly: 2024 Proposed Compensation Guidelines, Resolutions, 2025 Proposed Budget and Assembly Orientation.

Jon Hanson and Pastor Kristine will attend the assembly as voting members.

The theme verse of the 2024 Synod Assembly is **Romans 12:5** "So we, who are many. are **ONE BODY** 

"one body in Christ" IN CHRIST, and individually we

are members one of another."

#### **Excerpts from Bishop Dee** Pederson's 2024 Synod **Assembly Theme Series – Part 2**

The theme of the 2024 Synod Assembly is "One Body in Christ".

The body of Christ is the church. St. Paul likens the church to the human body:

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the

body does not consist of one member but of many. 1 Corinthians 12:12-14

And then, Paul goes on to point out the importance of the various parts of our bodies – feet, ears, eyes, hands – each is important and necessary, each honored. Why?

That there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. 1 Cor. 12:25-27

Living as the church, the body of Christ, is not something we invent ourselves. This body receives its oneness from the grace and power of God. As Paul also says,

There is one body and one Spirit - just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call - one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. Ephesians 4:4-5

What a gift we have received in our baptism into the Triune God! What good news we have to live!

We are one body in Christ. We are fully in the presence of Christ and belong to Christ. That identity is not ours because we signed up to join a club. It is given in Holy Baptism, as Christ gathers God's children "in" himself. That means we are one with each other in Christ. We belong to each other. We are one, amid our diversity.

While there are many questions that face the church these days, being "in" Christ provides both promise and direction.

You are "in" Christ. This is the promise: For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God IN Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:38-39.

You are "in" Christ. Your direction for the present and the future is clear: Love God. Love neighbor.

One body in *Christ*. Christ: How do we say or hear this name for Jesus? How do we use God's name? Like the Small Catechism says, do we use it "to curse, swear, practice magic, lie, or deceive"? Or "to call on, pray to, praise, and give thanks to God?"

Note what Paul says:

*Now I appeal to you, brothers* and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you but that you be knit together in the same mind and the same purpose. 1 Cor. 1:10

The words of St. Paul over two thousand years ago are so relevant for our life together and even the survival of the church today. Paul reminds us that in baptism, you and I are *joined to* Christ the Anointed One. And it is God who establishes us with you in Christ, and has anointed us, and who has also put his seal on us and given us his Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee. 2 Cor. 1:21-22.

In our baptism into Christ, we are made one. Baptism doesn't make us identical, nor does it take away our differences.

All of us live in a culture that tries to pit us against each other. In this time, may we live our belief that it is in the foolishness of the cross that God's greatest wisdom and gift is known. May you live as though you are one body in Christ, because you are. One. Body. In. Christ.
