


#### INTRODUCTION FOR THE DAY

Sabbath-keeping is meant for the welfare of all, according to Deuteronomy. God delivered the Israelites out of slavery, so they should observe this freedom with a day of rest. No one should work seven days a week; even slaves and foreigners should be able to rest. Yet human beings can turn even the most liberating religious practice into a life-destroying rule. Jesus does not reject sabbath-keeping, but defends its original life-enhancing meaning. Our worship and our religious way of life are to lead to restoration: the hungry being fed and the sick being healed.

# \*\*CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

# **LESSON: 1 Samuel 3:1-20**

At a time when visions are rare and unexpected, the Lord comes to Samuel and calls him to speak the divine word. Though just a boy, Samuel responds to God obediently, as Eli the priest has taught him to respond. This marks the beginning of Samuel's prophetic ministry.

# PSALM 139:1-6, 13-18

- L <sup>1</sup>LORD, you have searched me out; O LORD, you have known me.
- C <sup>2</sup>You know my sitting down and my rising up; you discern my thoughts from afar.
- L <sup>3</sup>You trace my journeys and my resting-places and are acquainted with all my ways.
- C 4Indeed, there is not a word on my lips, but you, O LORD, know it altogether.
- L <sup>5</sup>You encompass me, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me.
- C <sup>6</sup>Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain to it.
- L <sup>13</sup>For you yourself created my inmost parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb.
- C <sup>14</sup>I will thank you because I am marvelously made; your works are wonderful, and I know it well.

- L <sup>15</sup>My body was not hidden from you, while I was being made in secret and woven in the depths of the earth.
- C <sup>16</sup>Your eyes beheld my limbs, yet unfinished in the womb; all of them were written in your book; my days were fashioned before they came to be.
- L 17How deep I find your thoughts, O God! How great is the sum of them!
- C <sup>18</sup>If I were to count them, they would be more in number than the sand; to count them all, my life span would need to be like yours.

### **LESSON: 2 Corinthians 4:5-12**

When we carry out God's ministry we do so not for our glory but for the sake of Jesus Christ whom we proclaim as Lord. The power for ministry comes from God, not us, so that we persevere no matter what, trusting in God's power and promises at work through us.
