

Introduction

Our God makes all things new. In the first reading God promises it. In the gospel Mary anticipates it, anointing Jesus' feet with costly perfume in preparation for the day of his burial. In the second reading Paul recalls his transformation from the persecutor Saul into an apostle. In baptism, God's new person (you!) rises daily from the deadly mire of trespasses and sins.

CALL TO WORSHIP

Isaiah 43, Psalm 126, John 12

- P The days ahead are dark and full of foreboding.
- C We watch as Jesus journeys to the cross.
- P There is no way to change what is to come.
- C Yet death does not have the final word.
- P Let us bear witness to God's new life moving within and among us.
- C God is doing a new thing. Let us rejoice and give thanks!

**CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

- P If we ask God to restore us to the way we have been, then we have not asked for as much as God intends to give.
 God is not content simply to return or restore us to former things.
 Instead, God seeks to give the gift of resurrection—a new and abundant life.
 With confidence in God's generosity, we confess our sins and seek the new life offered in Jesus Christ.
- C Purifying God, we grow comfortable with the way things are in our lives, in the church, and in the world. We do not always welcome the new life you offer in Christ, for you overturn our notions of power and protocol. Sure of our own righteousness, we are critical of others.

Forgive us, we pray, for seeking our gain at the expense of others. Help us bend our lives toward your own life of self-giving and sacrifice. Fill us, our homes and churches, the whole world, with the abundant love of Christ until all are made new.

In Christ's name, we pray. Amen.

- P The apostle Paul reminds us that we do not make ourselves righteous. *Phil. 3:9* Our righteousness comes through faith in Christ, who has made us his own. Hear the good news! In Jesus Christ we are forgiven. The old life has passed away—and a new life has begun. Amen.
- C Forgetting what lies behind, Phil. 3:13–14 and straining forward to what lies ahead, we press on toward the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

GREETING

- P The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
- C And also with you.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

- P Let us pray.
- C Creator God, you prepare a new way in the wilderness, and your grace waters our desert. Open our hearts to be transformed by the new thing you are doing, that our lives may proclaim the extravagance of your love given to all through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Lesson: Isaiah 43:16-21

The prophet declares that long ago God performed mighty deeds and delivered Israel from Egyptian bondage through the waters of the sea. Now, God is about to do a new thing, bringing the exiles out of Babylon and through the wilderness in a new Exodus.

PSALM 126

- L When the LORD restored the fortunes of Zion, then were we like those who dream.
- C ²Then was our mouth filled with laughter, and our tongue with shouts of joy. Then they said among the nations, "The LORD has done great things for them."
- L ³The LORD has done great things for us, and we are glad indeed.
- C ⁴Restore our fortunes, O LORD, like the watercourses of the Negeb.
- L 5Those who sowed with tears will reap with songs of joy.
- C Those who go out weeping, carrying the seed, will come again with joy, shouldering their sheaves.

LESSON: Philippians 3:4b-14

Writing to Christians in Philippi, Paul admits that his heritage and reputation could give him more reason than most people to place confidence in his spiritual pedigree. But the overwhelming grace of God in Jesus calls Paul to a new set of values.
