


Lesson: 1 Samuel 17:1a, 4-5, 19-21, 32-50

In this passage, the description of the soldier Goliath vividly depicts the superiority of Philistine military might. In contrast, young David is armed with a slingshot and faith in God. David's victory witnesses to the whole earth that "there is a God in Israel."

PSALM 9:9-20

- L ⁹You, O LORD, will be a refuge for the oppressed, a refuge in time of trouble.
- C 10 Those who know your name will put their trust in you, for you never forsake those who seek you, O LORD.

Paul and his fellow workers experience great hardships and even rejection while carrying out their missionary work. Nevertheless, Paul continuously proclaims that God has not rejected us but is graciously working for our salvation.
