


OPENING HYMN "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name!" (vs. 1-3) ELW #634

Introduction

Even after Israel had experienced the vagaries of kings, the people still longed for a true king to set things right. He would have the king's title of Anointed One (Messiah); he would be the "one like a human being" (Son of Man) given dominion in Daniel's vision. Jesus is given these titles, even though he is nothing like an earthly king. His authority comes from the truth to which he bears witness, and those who recognize the truth voluntarily listen to him. We look forward to the day he is given dominion, knowing his victory will be the nonviolent victory of love.

DIALOG FOR CHRIST THE KING

- P Behold, the King comes. Alleluia!
- C O come, let us worship and bow down. Alleluia! Alleluia!
- P Rejoice greatly, for Christ is your King.
- C Blessing and honor and glory be unto him.
- P Blessed are you, O Lord, King of the universe; you have delivered us from sin and death.
- C By your blood, you have brought your people into your kingdom.
- P Therefore God has highly exalted him:
- C And bestowed on him the name which is above every name;
- P That at the name of Jesus, every knee shall bow:
- C And every tongue confess him the King of glory.
- P Behold, the King comes. Alleluia!
- C O come, let us worship and bow down. Alleluia! Alleluia!

READING: Revelation 11:15-17

- P Then the seventh angel blew his trumpet, and there were loud voices in heaven, saying,
- C "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Messiah, and he will reign forever and ever."
- P Then the twenty-four elders who sit on their thrones before God fell on their faces and worshipped God, singing,

C "We give you thanks, Lord God almighty, who are and who were; for you have taken your great power and begun to reign."

HYMN "Crown Him with Many Crowns" (vs. 3) ELW #855

READING: Revelation 12:10-11

- P Then I heard a loud voice proclaiming,
- C "Now have come the salvation of our God and the authority of his Messiah, for the accuser of our comrades has been thrown down, who accuses them day and night before our God."
- P "But they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony,
- C "for they did not cling to life even in the face of death."

HYMN "Crown Him with Many Crowns" (vs. 4) ELW #855

READING: Revelation 5:12, 9, 10, 13

- P "Worthy is the Lamb who was slaughtered"
- C "and by his blood ransomed for God saints from every tribe and language and people and nations,"
- P "and made them to be a kingdom and priests serving God."
- C "To the one seated on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!"

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

- P Sovereign God we confess we have given idols power over us, the idols of power and wealth, fame and security. We confess we have fallen into the ways of this world and have forgotten our kindred in Christ. We have lost sight of the reign of God here on earth, and instead have allowed the idols of the world to rule over us.
- C Forgive us. Call us into Your reign, to declare You the One who has power over us because Your power is love. Call us to love our neighbors as ourselves, and to work for justice, show mercy, and love one another in the name of Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.
- P Jesus came to us not to reign as a king over us, but to serve us, and to show us the way of God is the way of love. Jesus said the first would be last and the last would be first. Jesus called us to become humble and serve one another,

and that the most important commandment was to love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves. This is the way of our Sovereign. Go, knowing you are forgiven, and love and serve one another, especially our neighbors in need, as Christ serves us.

LESSON: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

To the community for whom this passage was written, it seemed as though the oppression they were experiencing would never end. Daniel's message is: It shall end. The Ancient One, who is judge, will call all nations to account and will give dominion to "one like a human being," the Messiah.

- C ⁴Mightier than the sound of many waters, mightier than the breakers of the sea, mightier is the LORD who dwells on high.

LESSON: Revelation 1:4b-8

The book of Revelation begins by celebrating the Almighty God, who spans all of time. Similarly, Jesus is celebrated as the firstborn from the dead who rules over the world's rulers. He is the one whose return we eagerly await.
