

Greetings from Pastor Kristine Isder

June 22 marked the 10th anniversary of my ordination as a pastor in the ELCA. I was ordained at Grace Lutheran Church in Westbrook by Bishop Jon V. Anderson. On July 1 I started my first call at Kviteseid Lutheran Church. On December 1, 2019, I also began serving Big Bend Lutheran Church.

How did I end up being a pastor? In my first occupation, I was an accountant at a farm management company in Windom. I started as a bookkeeper and worked up to accountant and then to vice president of the company. I also kept the company's computer system running. It was a stressful job.

Through the years I became more involved in church activities. I joined a women's circle Bible study, served on the church council as a deacon, occasionally led adult Sunday school and gave sermons. I served on the synod outreach board and attended conference and synod assemblies. My husband Rich served as a voting member at the Churchwide Assembly in 2003 and I went along as a visitor. That experience really opened my eyes to all the things going on in the church across the country and around the world. I was a voting member at the Churchwide Assembly in 2005 and was a volunteer in 2009. I enjoy learning about what is going on in the church and meeting other people involved in the church.

In 2007 I was at a church coaching conference and was asked if I was really happy. I had to think about that for a while. In the course of the conversation, I realized that I wasn't happy, mostly because of my work situation. I was getting burned out from all of the hours and stress of my job.

I started having discussions with my pastor, Roy Williams, about vocation. He helped me see that I was uncomfortable because I wasn't where God wanted me to be.

He suggested I develop some new interests to see what they may lead to. In the fall of 2008 I took a Lay School of Theology class online from Luther Seminary on the Gospel of Mark. I really enjoyed the class and learning more about Mark and the Bible. At the same time at my job, I was working on income reports. One day I realized that studying the Bible was more interesting to me than preparing income reports. That was when I started to think about pursuing some type of ministry career.

On October 31, 2008, I turned in my resignation at work, realizing it was time to get out of it. I had no plans other than to take some time off and see what came along. Sometimes you have to close one door so another door can open up. I did agree to stay

on at the company part time as a computer consultant with reduced responsibilities and hours.

I kept scanning the help wanted ads but nothing ever appealed to me. People kept asking me what I was going to do with the rest of my life. I was still interested in some type of ministry career and kept waiting for definite signs of what I should be doing.

A close relative told me I should consider a career in some type of church work since I was so active and involved in my church.

In the fall of 2009, I had another discussion with Pastor Roy. I asked him if it was wrong to coast out of life and enjoy early retirement with Rich. I was somewhat comfortable working part time and having time to do other things, but I felt like something was missing. He said I was being called to a deeper ministry in the church. I agreed with that. We talked some more and I went home to think about the discussion.

I'm glad he told me he thought I was being called into ministry because I don't know when I would have figured it out. I prayed for direction on the path God wanted me to follow.

After that conversation, there were several events that seemed to be pointing me towards seminary and a career in the ministry.

I finally realized that I was being called into the ministry. I had been struggling with the call. I thought it might be a lightning strike or a sudden revelation. The more I thought about it, I realized the call is a series of small events or signs that keep pointing in the same direction. I had been called for quite a while and didn't see it.

But God kept providing signs until I finally figured it out.

From there, events moved rapidly in two months: Rich and I attended Ventures in Vocation at Luther Seminary, I visited with one of the synod ministers, began the candidacy process, applied and was accepted into seminary.

When I told people that I was going to attend seminary, they weren't surprised. Most people seemed to see it coming before I did. Why was I the last to know?

I started classes at Luther Seminary in St. Paul in July of 2010 with summer Greek, commuting weekly from Windom. After two years of classes, I served a one-year internship at Lac qui Parle Lutheran by Dawson. Then I returned to Luther Seminary for my last year of classes graduating in May of 2014. In March I interviewed at Kviteseid and in May the congregation voted to call me as their pastor. I began my call at Kviteseid on July 1.



LOCAL NEWS June Joint Council Meeting

Kviteseid Lutheran Church Joint Council Minutes

June 19, 2024

Members Present: Tom Moe, Rob Schwendemann, Sherry Norby, Andy Streed, Brandon Ascheman, Bryan Schuerman, Cory Heinrich, Jon Hanson, Heidi Spray, Sue Streed and Pastor Kristine Isder.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 by President Tom Moe.

Pastor Kristine gave devotions and a prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: The secretary's report was reviewed with no changes.

Treasurer's Report: There is a large project that will need to have approval by the congregation in the near future.

Deacon's Report: There were 77 people at the May 26 service at the lake. The Deacons are working on welcome packets/baskets that will be delivered to people living in our area, with no church affiliation.

Trustee's Report:

- The projector bulb has been replaced, which gives a much clearer image on the screen.
- The Trustees got rid of a lot of items on Milan Clean-Up Day.
- The roof leak in Pastor's office has been fixed.
- The soffit and fascia will be replaced on the Education wing and the secretary's office has a new thermostat.
- A dehumidifier will be installed in the Geo-Thermal room to improve air circulation.
- The bid for the landscaping and wall structure project on the east side of the church and by the bell tower has come in at a number larger than the Trustees can approve, so there will need to be a special Congregational Meeting to approve that.

Board of Education: The Sunday School students did a beautification project at the end of the year with flowers, painted rocks, etc. There were 12 students (2 from Big Bend) at Vacation Bible School. They had snacks, played games, worked on projects, made wind chimes and "snackle" boxes.

Pastor's Report:

- Church attendance was as follows: April: 40-104, May: 34-79, June: 28-38. Online reached 89-204.
- Holy Week was interesting as the Palm Sunday service was shortened due to an impending storm. The Maundy Thursday service was held in the dark due to a power outage. The organ decided not to work for the Good Friday service, and on Easter Sunday, some guy came back from the dead!
- Four students received their first communion, three youth were confirmed and two graduating seniors were recognized.
- Worship time will change to 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, July 14 and remain that way until June 30, 2025.
- Pastor Kristine was recognized at Synod Assembly for the 10th anniversary of her ordination.
- There is a dire shortage of people going into the ministry and area churches are feeling the results of that.

Motion was made by Brandon Ascheman to approve all reports, seconded by Bryan Schuerman. Motion carried.

Old Business: None.

<u>New Business</u>:

- God's Work Our Hands Sunday will be September 8th.
- The council reviewed the proposed revisions to Kviteseid's funeral policy which included updates and charging \$50 for the use of the church for a funeral of a non-member. Copies will be sent to area funeral homes. Motion was made by Jon Hanson, seconded by Brandon Ascheman, to approve the proposed changes. Motion carried.
- Motion was made by Jon Hanson, seconded by Sue Streed, to have a Special Congregational Meeting on Sunday, July 14, at 9:45 a.m. to discuss and vote on the landscaping and structural repairs to the east side of the church and by the bell tower. Motion carried.

We closed the meeting by praying the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be September 18.

Synod News

2024 Synod Assembly Recap

The 2024 Synod Assembly was held June 7 and 8 both online and in person at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter.

Jon Hanson and Pastor Kristine attended the assembly online as voting members.

The theme of the assembly was "One Body in Christ" (Romans 12:5)

Friday night was a time of celebration, honoring congregations who reached milestone anniversaries, pastors who had retired and who reached milestone ordination anniversaries.

Pastor Kristine was honored for her 10-year ordination anniversary.

Two people from our Companion Synod partners of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Southern Africa were present: Presiding Bishop NkosiNathi Myaka and Diocesan Council Chair Mr. Mkhize. Their teaching time focused on the state of the church in South Africa, which is impacted by devastating weather changes, political instability, economic challenges, and continuing health needs. Yet they clearly proclaimed God's power and presence in these times, and then united the assembly in singing and dancing as the evening concluded.

Saturday began with worship in Christ Chapel. In her message, Bishop Dee Pederson talked about how Jesus often surprises us and turns upsidedown things we thought we knew. She drew upon the meaning of the 3rd Petition of the Lord's Prayer to consider how God's will might be done to, for, in, and among us in our congregations and communities.

Rev. Seyward Ask was installed as a Synod Minister.

A total of 376 people were in attendance onsite and on zoom, consisting of 217 Lay Leaders and 159 Rostered Ministers. The quorum was met.

The keynote speaker was Rev. Dr. Aaron Suomala Folkerds, who wove together personal stories and Scripture to teach concrete tools for better connections with others. Quoting Mother Theresa he noted, "If we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten that we belong to each other."

He suggested tools available to us that maintain connection: connection helps us deal with the sufferings of life; be in awe; anything mentionable is manageable; Be an illuminator and not a diminisher; laugh at life; sleep and exercise; gratitude; wisely use the 2026. phone, reframe and resilience; forgiveness; and Jesus binds us all together.

The ELCA churchwide report was given by Rev. Dr. Philip Hirsch, ELCA Executive Director for Christian Community and Leadership.

Pastor Kristine and Jon attended the workshop he presented during lunch.

Bishop Dee's report focused on 5 signs of life and health that she sees across our synod as God's will is being done "to, for, in, and among us." In a time when ministry is rapidly changing, she believes these signs can point the way into the future:

Living as one. Living as a body. Living together in Christ-like, healthy relationships. Living as partners with each other. Living in Christ as hope for the world.

Her report included a story from the memorial service giving thanks for the life of Shirley Anderson, wife of former synod bishop Rev. Charles Anderson. Shirley's memorial was held at St. John's Lutheran in Northfield, and Rev. Jonathan Davis told the story of how he and Charles began to challenge themselves to figure out how to summarize the Gospel in as few words as possible. When it came down to choosing one word, Rev. Davis said it is "with" because this is the most fundamental thing about God,

about the Incarnation, and how we are to be with each other. She believes this is what it means to be church together and a synod, literally "walking with" each other.

Once again, our neighbor, Borgund Lutheran, was presented with the Breadbasket Award in recognition of raising over \$34 per member to support ELCA World Hunger.

Action taken by the Assembly: election of synod council and churchwide assembly voting members, approving compensation guidelines for 2025, and adopting the budget for

Three resolutions were presented. One was withdrawn, one regarding the Human Sexuality Statement was not adopted, and the third one passed which approved changes in the synod constitution.

The Assembly also gave thanks for the life and ministries of rostered ministers who passed away this year.

Bishop Dee thanked everyone for the generosity of the Mission Support shared with the synod for their many ministries so that the people of our communities live out and share the good news of Jesus Christ, especially in these changing times. Synod staff walks with congregations to equip lay and rostered ministers for leadership and training; seeks candidates for

calls; equips Church Councils and Call Committees; provides pastoral care and consultation and communication, supports synod commit- "one body in Christ"



tee and governance work; supports global partnerships; and provides a link to our many partners across the state and churchwide.
