PROFESSION OF FAITH

Martin Luther's explanation of the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed from the Small Catechism.

Black Cross	Symbolizes Jesus' death and pain and reminds us that faith in Jesus is what saves us. "For one who believes from the heart will be justified" –Rom 10:10
Red Heart	Even though the cross is black, it does not kill our hearts, but makes us alive. "The just shall live by faith" – Rom 1:17
White Rose	Faith in Jesus brings true joy, consolation and peace, not worldly joy and peace – John 14:27. White is the color of angels and blessed spirits.
Blue Sky	Symbolizes our hope for the coming joys of heaven, though not yet revealed.
Gold Rim	As a circle is unending, so the joys of heaven will be unending. Its gold color reminds us that the joys of heaven are more precious than any other treasure.
