
Places of the Passion Lenten Service 2023

P The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

- C To see the depths of his love.
- P To behold the gift of his forgiveness.
- C To gaze upon the heights of his grace.
- P To marvel at the magnitude of his mercy.
- C We follow Christ to the courtyard.
- P It belongs to the High Priest Caiaphas—but Peter is there and so are others.
- C Peter denies Jesus three times.
- P But all is not lost. After his collapse, God's grace is amazing.

Confession and Forgiveness

- P Gracious and most merciful Father—
- C In the light of your holiness I see myself as I really am.
- P And I am guilty.

- C I confess that I have impure thoughts and unclean lips.
- P I think too highly of myself and too little of others.
- C I cling too tightly to the treasures of this world.
- P That I cannot open my hands to receive blessings from you.
- C My feet walk in the path of sin.
- P I wander astray and become a stranger to righteousness.
- C Forgive me, and set me again on the path that leads to life.
- P Deal with me not as I deserve, but according to your mercy.
- C Not because I am worthy but because you are gracious. Lord, have mercy! Christ, have mercy! Lord, have mercy!

(Please silently reflect on the fact that though our sin is great, Christ's love is greater.)

P Hear the good news! Jesus walked to places of rejection, suffering, torment and death—for you. Jesus was determined to go to Gethsemane and Golgotha—for you. That's why Jesus forgives you completely and loves you eternally. Faithful Lord, with me abide.

C I shall follow where you guide.
