

INTRODUCTION FOR THE DAY

The mustard seed becomes a great shrub that shelters the birds, recalling ancient images of the tree of life. We'd expect a cedar or a sequoia, but Jesus finds the power of God better imaged in a tiny, no-account seed. It's not the way we expect divine activity to look. Yet the tree of life is here, in the cross around which we gather, the tree into which we are grafted through baptism, the true vine that nourishes us with its fruit in the cup we share. It may not appear all that impressive, but while nobody's looking it grows with a power beyond our understanding.

**CALL TO WORSHIP

- P The kingdom of God is like a mustard seed, Mark 4:31–32 which is the smallest of seeds on earth;
- C it grows up and becomes the greatest of shrubs, and the birds of the air make nests in its shade.
- P Give thanks to God, whose promised reign is coming.
- C Thanks be to God!

**CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P God will not count our trespasses against us, 2 Cor. 5:19–20 longing instead for us to be reconciled. We come before God, then, in honesty, humility, and hope.

C Gracious God,

we so often miss your kingdom at work among us.
Captivated by power and prestige,
we overlook the mustard seeds you have planted all around.
Forgive us for failing to notice where and how you are at work.
Forgive us when we work against your plans and purposes—
fostering divisions when you have called us
to a ministry of reconciliation;
beset by apathy when the world has such deep needs;
building walls to keep people out when your branches
offer generous nests.

LESSON: 1 Samuel 15:34 - 16:13

Saul, anointed by the prophet Samuel as the first king of Israel, displeases the Lord. The Lord therefore sends Samuel to Bethlehem, where he anoints David, the youngest of the sons of Jesse, to succeed Saul as king.

PSALM 20

- L May the LORD answer you in the day of trouble, the name of the God of Jacob defend you;
- C ²send you help from the sanctuary and strengthen you out of Zion;
- L ³may the LORD remember all your offerings and accept your burnt sacrifice;
- C ⁴grant you your heart's desire and prosper all your plans.

LESSON: 2 Corinthians 5:6-17

Paul encourages believers to live by faith and not by sight. We do not consider Jesus from a human perspective but through the eyes of faith, believing he died for all and was raised. All who are in Christ are now in God's new creation.
